Flooding in Niger has displaced millions and significantly damaged homes, farmland, and infrastructure.

Since June 339 people have died and more than 1.1 million people have been displaced due to ongoing flooding in Niger. Critical resources, cultural sites, and schools have all been continually damaged by the intensified rain season, as heavier and erratic rainfall becomes more and more common.

Climate change disproportionately affects poor and developing nations. Like many economically fragile countries, Niger simply does not have the financial means to implement climate-resilient infrastructure, especially when survival and subsistence become a priority by necessity.

There's an urgent need for global action on climate change mitigation; that action must be tempered by compassion for those who bear the consequences of decisions very often made by the developed world.
