



A freeze on foreign aid spending by the United States Government will halt essential humanitarian aid to millions people around the world.

On Friday, a federal judge temporarily blocked President Donald Trump's sweeping plan to place thousands of U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) staffers on paid leave.

With USAID's funding pipelines disrupted, essential aid—ranging from food to medical supplies—has slowed or halted entirely. "This debate in D.C. on bureaucratic shakeups is in reality defining who will live and who will die abroad," warned Scott Paul of Oxfam.

The ripple effects of losing USAID will be felt deeply across the Pacific and beyond, where NGOs and vulnerable communities rely on sustained support. Actearoa New Zealand's decision to step forward in leadership or risk losing ground to instability will reflect our commitment to global solidarity.
