



Concerns are mounting over South Sudan, as fears grow that the fragile peace established in 2018 may unravel into renewed civil war.

South Sudan's fragile peace is at risk as tensions escalate. Government forces recently detained senior opposition figures, prompting international condemnation.

Clashes in Nasir resulted in the deaths of a senior general and UN personnel. The U.S. evacuated non-emergency staff, while Uganda deployed special forces to support President Kiir's government. Economic hardship has worsened due to damage to the country's vital oil pipeline, deepening the crisis.

The UN warns that the situation could deteriorate further, urging dialogue to prevent renewed conflict. With frustrations mounting, urgent diplomatic intervention is needed to stabilize South Sudan and prevent a return to full-scale war.
