Iran and the United States are set to resume nuclear talks in Oman, despite rising threats and deep mistrust.

In Central Africa, Rwanda and the DRC have signed a U.S.-backed peace framework after months of border tension.

Meanwhile, Ukraine accepted a UN ceasefire proposal, but Russia rejected it, stalling progress once more.

Each situation remains volatile—but each also reminds us that peace often begins in slow, uncertain steps.
