



In Nigeria, long-standing tensions over land, religion, and identity are colliding with armed insurgencies and violence.

In Plateau and Benue, herder/farmer clashes have killed dozens and displaced thousands, driven by long-standing tensions over land, identity, and climate stress. Plateau's governor has called recent attacks in Bassa "genocide" against Indigenous communities.

In the North East, Boko Haram and ISWAP have launched renewed assaults - killing farmers, bombing roads, and abducting civilians. Officials warn insurgents are regrouping, and rural communities remain vulnerable.

As conflict spreads, over 33 million Nigerians now face food insecurity. Displacement, disrupted farming, and dwindling aid have created a deepening humanitarian crisis—one that calls for urgent prayer and international response.
