The Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) is disbanding, ending a decades-long insurgency against the Turkish state.

The PKK, designated a terrorist organisation by Türkiye, the U.S., and the EU, had fought since the 1980s, originally seeking Kurdish independence before shifting toward cultural and political rights.

The conflict has claimed over 40,000 lives and displaced thousands, leaving deep scars across Türkiye's southeast.

The group's decision follows a rare appeal from jailed leader Abdullah Öcalan urging a peaceful path forward. While officials hailed the move as historic, many Kurdish citizens remain wary amid continued cultural suppression.

The development could also reshape Kurdish dynamics in Syria and Iraq, where PKK-aligned militias have played key roles.
