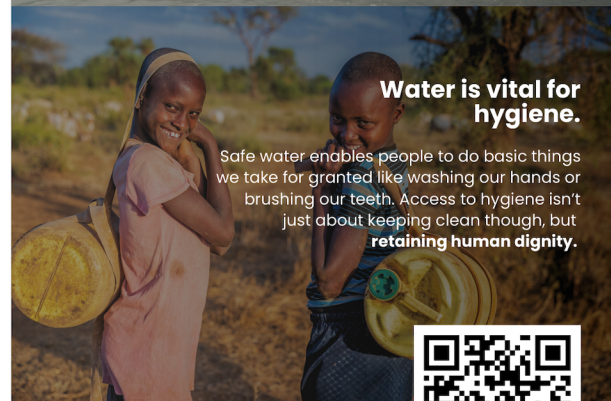
Water is vital for sanitation.

Keeping the places where we live, work and take care of ourselves clean and sanitary is incredibly important. Our Water and Sanitation programme has provided **new shower facilities** in Fiji and **sanitation facilities** in Tonga.
