Gaza is a visible example of the millions worldwide who are facing famine due to conflict and war.

According to the 2025 Global Report on Food Crises, 295 million people across 53 countries faced high levels of acute food insecurity in 2024—triple the number in 2016. Conflict, displacement, climate shocks, and economic instability are driving crises in South Sudan, Yemen, Haiti, the Sahel, and the DRC.

In Gaza, the situation is especially dire. The Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC) warns that two of three famine thresholds—extreme food shortages and child malnutrition above 30%—have already been met.

While Gaza draws headlines, it is part of a broader trend: humanitarian systems under strain, and food increasingly used as a tool of war. Across the globe, food insecurity is not only a crisis of survival—but of dignity.
