This week, two devastating natural disasters struck some of the world's most fragile regions.

In Sudan, a landslide wiped out the entire mountain village of Tarasin, killing between 300 and 1,000 people. Only one survivor is known. Triggered by seasonal rains, the disaster struck an area already isolated by war. Sudan's ongoing conflict has displaced over 14 million people, while widespread flooding continues to destroy homes and block aid access.

In Afghanistan, a 6.0 magnitude earthquake killed at least 1,400 people and levelled entire villages in the east. Search and rescue efforts are ongoing with limited resources.

These events highlight how natural disasters strike hardest where poverty, conflict, and climate extremes collide — and how easily these tragedies can be overlooked when they fall outside the spotlight of global media.
