

PRAY THE NEWS

Hurricane Melissa made landfall in Jamaica on 28 October as one of the strongest storms on record.

With winds exceeding 280 km/h, it caused catastrophic damage — uprooting trees, destroying homes, and knocking out power to over half a million people.

Western Jamaica, known as the nation's breadbasket, was hit hardest. Crops were flattened, threatening food supply and exports.

The roof of Black River Hospital was torn off, and at least four people have died. St John's Anglican Church in Black River and Lacovia St. Thomas Church were both destroyed.

The Anglican Church is coordinating a local response, supported by the Anglican Alliance.

Melissa has also caused flooding and loss of life in Haiti and Cuba. Communities already hit by Hurricane Beryl earlier this year are now facing a long and painful recovery.
