



A devastating wave of floods and landslides has swept across Indonesia, Sri Lanka, and southern Thailand after weeks of heavy rain and severe weather.

In Indonesia, torrential rains caused deadly mudflows and river overflows in West Sumatra. At least 708 people are confirmed dead, with hundreds still missing in remote areas.

In Sri Lanka, more than 330 people have died in flooding and landslides caused by Cyclone Ditwah — the island's deadliest storm in decades.

In Thailand, 176 people have been killed by flash floods across southern provinces, with widespread damage to homes, roads, and farmland.

Despite the scale, global attention has been limited. Scientists warn that extreme weather events like these are becoming more frequent and intense in a warming climate — impacts felt hardest by the poorest and most exposed.
