



PRAY THE NEWS

Severe rains and flooding have overwhelmed northern Morocco, forcing one of the country's largest evacuations.

More than 143,000 residents have been evacuated from flood-prone areas, including much of Ksar El Kebir, where up to 85% of the population fled rising waters and landslides.

At least four people have died — including three children — and one person remains missing. Over 150,000 are now displaced, sheltering in temporary camps or with relatives.

The torrential rains followed years of drought and were intensified by Storm Leonardo and Storm Marta, overwhelming dams and drainage systems.

For many families, the floods represent not just short-term hardship, but long-term loss of homes, livelihoods, and safety.
