A nation already enduring one of the world's gravest humanitarian crises is struck by disaster, as Venezuela braces for heavy casualties.

On the evening of 24 June, two powerful earthquakes — a 7.2 foreshock and a 7.5 quake seconds later — struck northern Venezuela, around 160km west of Caracas. Buildings collapsed in the capital, power failed, and rescuers began searching the rubble for survivors.

Acting President Delcy Rodríguez has declared a state of emergency, and the US Geological Survey has warned that casualties could run into the tens of thousands.

The disaster strikes a country already in deep crisis. Even before the quake, the UN estimated that 7.9 million Venezuelans — more than a quarter of the population — needed humanitarian assistance, and nearly eight million have already fled the country.
