

# PRAY THE NEWS

*A sudden glacial flood in Rasuwa is the sharpest blow in a monsoon that has already displaced thousands of families across Nepal.*

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On the morning of 26 August, a wall of water surged down the Bhotekoshi river in Nepal's Rasuwa district, sweeping away villages, roads and bridges near the China border. Scientists believe an ice-and-rock avalanche from a glacier briefly dammed the river before releasing a sudden surge.

At least 95 people have been confirmed dead and hundreds more are missing, including nearly 400 foreign tourists. The flood destroyed six major hydropower facilities and cut power across the region.

It is the sharpest blow in a punishing monsoon: over the past fortnight, the UN reports floods and landslides have killed 84 people, displaced more than 9,700 families and affected 270,000 people across 32 districts.
